<p><i>Breadth of Knowledge: GE 3S, 3H, and 3N</i> Requires three units. Students will be able to demonstrate basic competence in the principles, theories, and analytic methods used in each of the following: social sciences (3S), arts and humanities (3H), and natural sciences (3N).</p>	<p><i>Culture and Diversity: AE 4.1 & 4.2</i> Requires two units. AE 4.2 can be met by studying abroad. AE 4.1 - students will be able to investigate the diversity of the human experience within the United States. AE 4.2 - students will be able to examine a variety of perspectives in the global community.</p>
<p><i>Social Responsibility and Ethics: AE 5.1</i> Requires one unit. Unit can be paired with community service. Students will be able to develop and apply a combination of knowledge and skills to demonstrate an understanding of social responsibility and ethical behavior.</p>	<p><i>Integration and Creativity: AE 6</i> Requires one unit. Unit can be a course or an approved experience. Unit usually completed within major. Students will be able to analyze and combine information from different areas within or across disciplines to approach and explain existing questions and problems, pose new questions, and generate new ideas.</p>
